Who can become a Registered Apprenticeship Site?

Any Minnesota-based organization that currently employs or plans to employ a Community Health Worker registered apprentice full-time (32+ hours/week) with benefits.

Why become a Registered Apprenticeship Site?

Non-traditional apprenticeship programs in healthcare offer a workforce shortage solution for multiple occupations, including CHWs. Apprenticeships promote successful onboarding by complimenting an employer's current training program with technical instructions CHWs receive through their formal education. Employers can provide opportunities for additional internal or outsourced trainings.
